Mayor Croft announced that on September 16th, staff had received word that the California Department of Housing and Community Development approved and certified the City Housing Element. He commended staff and the consultant team for working diligently to ensure that the Housing Element received certification prior to the October 15th deadline. He stated it was the Council's commitment to carry out the various programs and policies in the Housing Element and that to provide consultation and guidance for the initial stages of a key part of the process, he was appointing Council Member Rogers and himself to an Ad Hoc Committee for the Development of an Ordinance for Mixed Use Housing.

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3.1 • APPROVAL OF LEASE OF WATER RIGHTS TO CITY OF CERRITOS

Derek Nguyen, Director of Water Resources, displayed slides and made a presentation based on the report in the agenda regarding the lease of water rights to the City of Cerritos. He stated that staff recommended that the City Council approve the lease of 700 acre-feet of Central Basin groundwater extraction rights to the City of Cerritos for each of FY 23/24, FY 24/25, and FY 25/26 for \$115,500 per year; and authorize its execution by the Director of Water Resources on behalf of the City.

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3.2 • ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES AUTHORIZATION, DAHLIN GROUP, WEINGART IMPROVEMENTS

Samantha Chambers, Assistant Project Manager, displayed slides and made a presentation based on the report in the agenda pertaining to the Weingart Senior Center improvement project. It was staff's recommendation that the City Council authorize work for the Weingart Senior Center improvements per the Dahlin Group proposal dated September 19, 2022, in an amount not to exceed \$297,200, and authorize the Mayor to sign the proposal.
